R25 billion for Waterberg development



President Cyril Ramaphosa is taking important steps to ensure that the communities of the Waterberg District Municipality receive water and infrastructure projects which are in line with the District Development Model.

President Cyril Ramaphosa has announced R25 billion for infrastructure projects in the Waterberg District Municipality in Limpopo.

The projects are expected to, among other things, address issues of severe water shortages in the district which is made up of the Bela-Bela, Lephalale, Modimolle-Mookgophong, Mogalakwena and Thabazimbi local municipalities.

Addressing residents at the Shongoane Sports Ground in Lephalale recently, the President said government would in the next five years complete the Moloko Water Resource Project.

During the period, government would also pursue the Waterberg rail-line and build several much-needed schools in various communities in the district.

"We know that the people of this district are confronted with severe unemployment and poverty. We know about the problems of water, electricity, sanitation and roads. We know about access to land," he said.

Government, he said, was also aware of the poor telecommunications network that frustrates economic development in the area.

"We need to attract investment in the area. We recently held the second SA Investment Conference and we raised R363 billion from private investment," he said.

A portion of that money was to be invested in the mining district.

"Government will invest R25 billion over the next five years, and that's a lot of money. Some companies will in this

Madlayelo ya xinawu ya vukati

Loko u ringetile xin'wana na xin'wana ku kondletela vukati, ndlhayavukati wu nga ha va ndlela ya kahle eka havumbirhi bya n'wina, wena na muringani wa wena. Ndlhayavukati wa tika na ku va na ntshikelelo eka mindyangu naswona endlelo ra xinawu ri nga hlanganisa nhloko.

Ndlhayavukati hi loko vukati byiherisiwa ximfumo ekhoto ya nawu. Josephine Peta, Muofosirinkulu wa Mafambiseloxinawu eka Hofisi ya Gqwetakulu ra swa Mindyangu ya Ndzwawulo ya Vululami na Nhluvukiso wa Vumbiwa, u hlamusela leswaku endlelo ra ndlhayavukati ri sungula loko samanisi ya rhumeriwa.

leswaku vukati bya yena byi n'okisiwa a nga kuma samanisi ra ndlhayavukati ekhoto ya le henbla kumbe ya xifundza, kumbe a tihlanganisa na tuyimeri wa swa nawu ku n'wi pfunu hi endlelo leri. Muringani loyi a sungulaka mafambiselo ya ndlhayavukati u vuriwa mumangari, kasi muringani lon'wana i mumangaleriwa," ku vula Peta.

Peta u hlamusele leswaku samanisi ro ndlhayavukati ri fanele ku:

- boxa leswaku ku hava nkoteko wo tivikana wa ku vuyisela vuxaka ematshwan'weni,
- endla ndzulamiselo wa avanyiso wa nhundzu ya wena ya nhlanganelo kumbe swipimelo

leswi twananiwaka eka ntwanano ku nga si tekaniwa emasungulweni ya vukati, na

- lulamisa leswaku i milulamiselo yihi yi nga ta endlwa ya vana va varingani, yo tanihu ku i mani loyi n'wana a nga ta tshama na yena.

"Samanisi ri fanele ku tlhela ri boxa leswaku mumangaleriwa u na 10 ra masiku – eka xiyimo laha a tshamaka endhawini yin'we tanihu mumangari, kumbe 20 wa masiku – loko mavandla ya tshama eka swifundzakulu swo hambana, ku hlamula samanisi leri," Peta a engetela.

Xikan'wekan'we loko nandzu wu pfuriwile, tidokhumente ti vuyiseriwa eka mumangari,

loyi a faneleke ku fikisa swikatsa swimbirhi swa tidokhumente leti eka xerifi ya le ndhawini leyi laha mumangaleriwa a tirhaka kumbe a tshamaka kona.

"Endzhaku ka swona xerifi yi ta fikisa tidokhumente hi yoxe eka mumangaleriwa kutani yi nyika ntiyisiso wo tsariwa wa mfikiso, lowu humesaka vumbonu bya leswaku tidokhumente ti fikisiwile. Laha ku nga na vana va khumbekaka, Hofisi ya Gqwetakulu ra swa Mindyangu yi fanele ku tivisiwa," Peta a kombisa.

Endzhaku ka nkarhi wa 10 kumbe 20 wa masiku, mumangari a nga ha tsarisa ndlhayavukati eka nxaxamelo wa khoto. Eka midlayavukati leyi nga na nkwegelbetano, mumangaleriwa u fanele ku hlamula samanisi hi xitiviso xa kungu ra ku kaneta mhaka leyi.

"Xikan'wekan'we loko swoleswo swi endlwile, yena u fanele ku ngenisa xikombelo ku nga si hundza nkarhi wo karhi. Xikombelo i xitatamente lexi eka xona mumangaleriwa a hlamulaka swihehlo leswi nga eka samanisi leri. Endzhaku ka loko xikombelo xi ngenisiwile, mumangari a

Certified documents now expire after six months

All government departments and its components have been directed to stop the practice of requiring certified copies of documents not older than three months to accompany applications for employment.

This decision follows complaints raised with President Cyril Ramaphosa on social media and through other channels about the requirements for compliance with public sector job applications.

Departments have been ad-

vised to at least accept certified copies of documents submitted with an application for employment that are up to six months old, in those cases where the document certified does not have an expiry date that falls within the six-month period, the Presidency said.

"Government has recognised that the practice to date impacts negatively on job seekers in the current economic climate in South Africa, and that there is a need to reduce the burden on job seekers to submit - with

each separate job application - certified copies of supporting documents (such as academic qualifications, which are not older than three months)," the Presidency said in a statement.

The Presidency said this change will also reduce the workload that the certification of documents creates for the South African Police Service personnel, who will now be able to devote more time to their core function of ensuring that South Africans are safe. Snews.gov.za **O**
